#### **ASYLUM SEEKERS**

Catholic Action continues to work in partnership with Le Pont, Welcome Collective and other asylum seeker services. Recently we have heard of some of our volunteers' refugee

claimant cases being rejected by the government. Two have been told that other places in their country could be safe for them to return to. The claimants say this is untrue, that they would be prosecuted if they return.



In both situations they are working and volunteering for more than one organization. One has been volunteering to assist other refugee claimants, Catholic Action has written letters of support for these individuals in support of their appeal. Please pray for them.

We continue to assist breaking isolation for these very important people in our community. Trips to Camp Kinkora, and various spots around the island are making seniors very happy and have experiences they have not had in decades!




though our weekly food bank, etc etc and they really deserved this special day!"



The Centre for Reproductive Loss acknowledges the reality of this grief and provides professional support services to those persons whose lives have been touched by these painful events. She addresses real issues including, forced abortion, infertility in general, miscarriage and other events surrounding this topic


