THE YEAR IN HIGHLIGHTS – 2022-2023

A year of welcoming, and breaking isolation.

Last summer, our volunteers showed exceptional dedication by going above and beyond their usual duties. We were thrilled to collaborate with Villa St. Martin Retreat Centre, a valuable addition to our Catholic Action team.

Starting with their capital fundraising initiative we introduced them to some of our partners including St. Patrick's Foundation. They have developed an excellent relationship and our moving forward with Father Kevin Kelly's renovation initiative.

Since Father Kevin was introduced to Catholic Action, he called on us for his important project assisting the Ukrainians as they arrived in Montreal.

As a temporary residence, the Ignatian Spirituality Centre (old Villa Saint Martin), re-opened its doors on June 16th to welcome Ukrainians, fleeing the war. Father Kevin invited us to meet with the minister of Immigration, the Red Cross and other 3rd party government groups. Catholic Action managed and scheduled the volunteers that were the welcoming group and drivers to take the Ukrainians to their Service Canada and Bank appointments. We assisted them with finding furniture and housing and sometimes jobs. However, Catholic Action's most important work, was managing the day camp in the summer and the daycare once school started. These programs allowed toddlers and young children to be just that. These families had traveled for days and before that, lived in siren-raging bombbooming environments. All were overjoyed with the programs, including French lessons by 2 young Jesuit interns. Our minibus took the kids to weekly outings and again Catholic Action volunteers as well as those from the Jesuit Refugee Service assisted us with chaperoning. It was very important work with a fragile community and our volunteers in their different capacities all played an important role in getting these families welcomed and established in our city.



We were invited to talk about our work with the Ukrainians, at Holy Name of Jesus Parish. We enjoyed a fabulous celebration of Christ with a vibrant church community. They were very generous with a donation to support our work.

Our One Voice Group is a great example of why Catholic Action exists. This group started with the English-Speaking Senior Centres, that were partially funded by the Father Dowd Foundation. It was apparent, early on, that there was no means for these important groups to share their best practices, collaborate on innovation and collectively represent the interests of the diverse and multicultural English-speaking seniors in the Greater Montreal region. At the behest of the Father Dowd Foundation, Catholic Action partnered with ESCC to create the "One Voice" coalition to serve the needs of underserved, English-Speaking seniors with the ultimate goal to reduce isolation.



Once this group was well established, Catholic Action transferred the management over to Seniors' Action Quebec. The work of this group fits more appropriately, under their umbrella.

The Covid environment highlighted the importance of the work of this group. In the almost 6 years of our existence, the coalition has continued to evolve including health care professionals, senior centre executive directors, advocates, etc. This cross-section of expertise, coupled with the leadership of the centres themselves, has evolved to a powerhouse team working to improve the inadequate service currently available to our English-speaking seniors.

Breaking Isolation - Minority Language Seniors

In support of our seniors, our volunteers, using a minibus took them on grocery runs, dollar store and lunch outings. We visited Chinese buffets, Pizza Hut, Walmart, the

Atwater Market and assisted a SASMAD project carrying members to a retreat. Trips to Camp Kinkora, and apple picking, and museums, were back on the agenda and lately, the popular "Quebec's Cabane A Sucre".

Once again, we were asked to lead the Black History event for the LaSalle D & D 50 + centre. It was huge success with over 75 participants, and representatives from all levels of government participating.


