#### defending refugee rights



On March 25th 2023, Canada and the USA expanded the Safe Third Country Agreement (STCA) to apply to the entire Canada-US land border. This means that **Canada is closed to asylum seekers** who pass through the USA, with very few exceptions. Since late March, the majority of people who have requested protection at the Canada-US border have been returned to the USA, where they risk detention and deportation to countries where they face persecution.


**There are no other pathways** to refugee status for people arriving in Canada via the USA. There's no line to wait in, no immigration program for these individuals.

Welcome Collective is part of a coalition of community and advocacy organizations participating in a major action to draw attention to this violation of refugee rights: a walk from Montreal to Roxham Road over 3 days in June, the weekend before World Refugee day [Facebook].

#### Catholics on serious decline ... especially in Quebec



The Catholic population in Canada has declined by almost 2 million people in the last 10 years, the Canadian census has found in a report that indicates the religiously unaffiliated now outnumber Catholics.

The latest census figures, compiled in 2021, show the Catholic Canadian population has declined to 10.9

million. Catholics now make up about 29.9% of the country's people. According to the 2011 census, the Catholic population that year was 12.8 million.

Just 53.3% of Canadians, 19.3 million people, now identify as Christian, a decline from 67.3% in 2011 and 77.1% in 2001. Statistics Canada, Canada's national statistical office, presented the latest figures in an Oct. 26 report.

Catholicism is still the most popular religious affiliation in all provinces and territories except for Nunavut, the sparse population of which has a large Anglican component.





Quebec is the only majority Catholic province, but Catholic numbers declined "considerably," Statistics Canada said. In 2011, 74.7% of Quebec residents reported that they were Catholic. The 2021 figures indicate 53.8% of Quebec residents identified as Catholic, a 21% reduction.

CNA contacted the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Archdiocese of Quebec for comment but did not receive a response by publication.


