Spotlight Todd Sinnett About Todd Sinnett - The Director of the Temporary Housing Project



- The Director of the Temporary Housing Project An educator, with military (Second Lieutenant in Canadian Infantry) and law onforcement expertise, certified in

Infantry) and law enforcement expertise, certified in Emergency Management (FEMA) and currently working on his theses on the Armenian Genocide, the soft spoken Todd Sinnett's recipe of gifts makes him an excellent director at the temporary housing project for the newcomers from Ukraine. Todd and I worked together last summer establishing the environment at the old Villa St. Martin to create a safe, welcoming, and efficient temporary housing environment to allow the new arrivals the time and space to get settled in Montreal and or other parts of Canada.

This year again, we partnered to get the facility up and running for a slightly different version of the same project. In a few short weeks, Catholic Action's volunteers were building dressers, hanging curtains, filling up the supplies for our "Welcome Room".

Under the covers there are a myriad of challenges that Todd had to deal with, various government inspections, hiring of staff, logistics for supplies to name a few. His quiet but firm demeanor is the perfect leadership style that makes the facility

purr like a kitten. When we spoke together these are some of the thoughts he shared.

In the second go around the similar project we ran last year, what do you find are the biggest differences? "This year's version of the project, I am the primary liaison with the various government agencies. As you know Judy, there are a lot of moving parts, the staff, the newcomers, the facility maintenance, but our team is good, which helps keep things running smoothly."


How are you enjoying this experience? "Yes, the fulfillment of helping people, the work is important, some of these people are in dire straights, it is important to do God's work and support them."

How important is your relationship with Catholic Action to the success of this project? "From the first go around last year, when your volunteers helped with the set up, you hired all the staff to run the day care, day camp and preschool, the volunteer drivers etc. and this year we may not have made our timelines without your volunteers support with the building of furniture, installation of curtain rods, setting up the welcome room. I know we can count on Catholic Action always."

Is there any message you personally would like to share with the Catholic community? "Firstly, thank you! Your generosity of sharing your time with us to assist the newcomers was a key part of our program. But a bigger message we can write to our local governments is the significant shortage in available affordable housing. Something needs to be done, it is an important problem for Quebecers, newcomers, and the community at large. Once again, thanks to our community for their generosity."


